✧ Denver's East Side Jewish community boasts many Orthodox synagogues: EDOS, affiliated with the OU; the DAT Minyan; Beis Menachem, a Chabad shul; the Western Center for Russian Jewry; KBY, a yeshivish minyan; Beit Uriel, a Sephardic minyan; and the BMH/BJ, which offers a *Mechitza Minyan* on Shabbat.

Schools:

✧ Denver Academy of Torah (DAT) is a modern Orthodox day school, operating since 1992, affiliated with Yeshiva University, and located on the Glassman Educational Campus in the Lowry neighborhood. DAT supports K-12 education.

✧ Hillel Academy, a pre-K–8 Torah U'Mesorah affiliate, has celebrated its 50th anniversary in observant Jewish education.

✧ The Denver Campus for Jewish Education comprises a nondenominational K–5 Jewish Day School, and a Jewish academic 6–12 high school. It has a beautiful new 18-acre campus and updated facilities.

✧ The Speer Parkway and Colfax Avenue provide convenient 15-minute access to the Yeshiva Toras Chaim and Beth Jacob High School for Girls on the West Side of Denver. BMH/BJ and the Jewish Community Center support preschools for children ages two through five.

✧ The Mikvah of East Denver (MOED) is being rebuilt. Please use the West Side or Southeast Mikvaot.

Eruv:

✧ Denver's East Side Jewish community supports this community-binding boundary to permit observant Jews to more freely attend shul and visit on Shabbat. A map of the area currently enclosed is found on the reverse side.

Food:

✧ Aside from the large selection of Kosher foods available at local supermarkets King Soopers, Safeway, Sprouts, Trader Joe's, and Natural Grocers, Denver's East Side features Kosher dining: Fleishig: The East Side Kosher Deli. The Deli supplies both Kosher commodities and a meat restaurant. Milchig: Brooklyn Pizza provides kosher pizza and extended hours.

✧ The Bagel Store supplies local baked goods, along with several other area supervised wholesale commercial bakeries, including King Soopers!

✧ Two Kashrut supervision organizations exist in Denver: the TRI-Sulom (Lion-Scroll and Raish-Mem) and the Va'ad Hakashrus of Denver (Scroll-K).
