

From The Rabbi's Desk

The Talmud (פסחים דף נג עמוד ב) tells us that when חנניה מישאל ועזריה were presented with the option of either bowing down to an idol or being cast into a fiery furnace, they made their decision based on the actions of the frogs in this week's פרשה as it says ועלו וְעָלוּ

וְעָלוּ . . . in your ovens. They reasoned that if frogs that are not commanded to give up their lives for the sanctity of Hashem's name were be willing to jump into a fiery oven, how much more so should they be willing Tosfos wonders why they had to consider the frogs. Is it not obvious that one has to give up his life rather than publicly worship an idol? The ר"י answers that it was obvious that if they had no other choice they would have to give up their lives, however in the case of חנניה מישאל ועזריה they could have run away. However, they realized that no individual frog was told to jump into the oven as the decree of Hashem was that the frogs fill the houses, bedrooms, beds, ovens and mixing bowls. Any individual frog could have chosen the significantly more desirable job of jumping on the bed. However, some frogs stepped up and gave their lives to sanctify Hashem's name and similarly they chose not to run away but to sanctify Hashem's name.

There are many times when it is obvious that something has to be done, but many of the individuals who have had the realization assume that someone else will take care of the job. Clearly if everyone took this approach, nothing would ever get



done. We should learn from the simple frogs to step up to the plate and take on the challenge of doing what has to be done.
