From The Rabbi's Desk

The Talmud (סוטה דף יג עמוד א) comments that the greatness of משה רבינו is seen at the beginning of this week's פרשה. While the entire nation was busy collecting the spoils of Egypt, משה was busy fulfilling the מצוה of finding the casket of יוסף and preparing his bones to be transported to Israel, as was promised to him. While this is indeed a laudable act, it is important to remember that the collection of the spoils was also a commandment from Hashem. Rashi, in last week's פרשה commented (רש"י שמות פרק יא פסוק ב) that Hashem specifically requested that the people collect the spoils so that אברהם אבינו not say that Hashem fulfilled the guarantee that his descendants would be slaves in a foreign land, but did not fulfill the promise that they would leave with riches. How could the Talmud imply that only משה was fulfilling a מצוה at this time?

The בעלי מוסר suggest that any person could have chosen to fulfill either of Hashem's commandments. The greatness of משה רבינו was that while everyone else chose to fulfill the commandment which would bring material wealth, he ignored the potential for personal gain and focused solely on what needed to be done.

Life has many obligations and it would be wrong to ignore any of them. We need to take care of our physical needs as well as our spiritual needs. However, the time and energy we spend on a particular obligation reflects the extent to which it is important to us. The main focus of our endeavors should not be towards material gain with spiritual growth being a secondary afterthought. Once our basic material needs have been fulfilled the bulk of our attention and efforts should be directed towards to our spiritual need to grow in our relationship with Hashem.

Rabbi Rapp returns to Denver February 17th-18th.

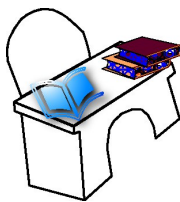

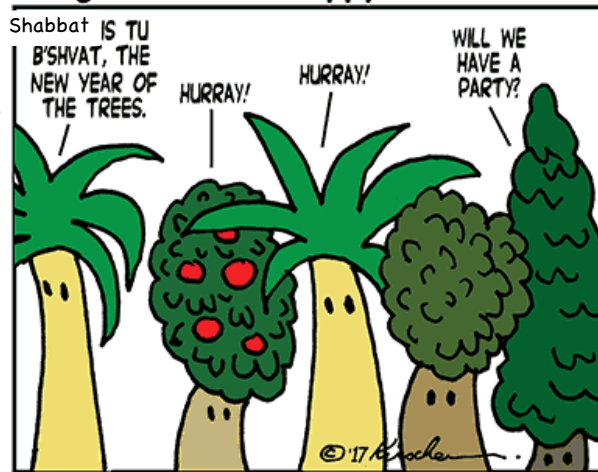
