From The Rabbi's Desk

The main focus of Parshat Terumah is the command to build the various vessels to be used in the משכן. In each case the word ועשית - and you (singular) shall make - is used. The one exception is regarding the first vessel which is mentioned, the ארון where the word ועשו - and you (plural) shall make - is used. Furthermore, all other words used regarding the commandment to make the ארון are singular (וצפית, ועשית, ויצקת). Why is the first command, to make the Aron, plural?

The תורה suggests that the words of the תורה come to teach an important lesson. Practically, there will be one individual artisan who will be involved in making each particular vessel. This could lead the individual to believe that it is his own talent that gave him the ability to accomplish this and that he can take personal credit for what he has achieved. The first reference to making the vessels is written in plural to emphasize that the abilities an individual has been given are not for him to enjoy alone. His talents and resources are God given, and he has been endowed with them for the purpose of serving the community and representing them in the construction of the Mishkan's vessels.

This is not a one time in history lesson. Many of us have been blessed with outstanding individual talents or material resources that allow us to accomplish great things. The lesson to be learned is that no matter how great our abilities, our true greatness shines when we channel our God given gifts towards the betterment of the community.
