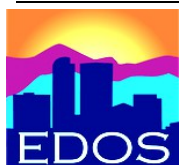

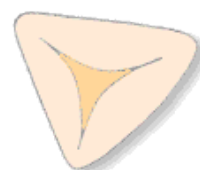

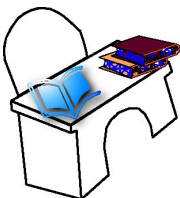

From The Rabbi's Desk

This week's Torah reading is different in that it may be best known for what is not in the פרשה. Specifically, this is the only פרשה in the final four books of the Torah that does not mention משה רבינו משה.

Interestingly, the day after we read פרשת תצוה we read מגילת אסתר - another book noted by what is missing. In this case it is the name of Hashem which does not appear. What is the significance of our main characters going missing?

The Talmud (מגילה דף לא עמוד א) tells us כל מקום שאתה מוצא גבורתו של הקדוש ברוך הוא אתה מוצא ענוותנותו - Hashem's greatness is seen with his humility. Hashem shows His greatness by saving us from the destructive plot of Haman and at the same time shows his humility by not having his name mentioned in the story. We are commanded to follow in the ways of Hashem, as it says והלכת בדרכיו (or in Latin - imitatio dei). Moshe follows in the ways of Hashem by being removed from this week's פרשה



despite the fact that he is responsible for the successful fulfillment of the commandments.

Everyone appreciates recognition for a job well done in all aspects of life, including our charitable work. The lesson to be learned from here is that when someone does you a favor, it is appropriate for you to note the good work and to show appreciation for it. However, when you are the person performing the act, the highest level you can reach is to do the act without receiving any honor from others.
