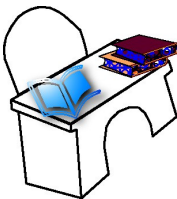

From The Rabbi's Desk

Through out שמות ספר, Moshe speaks to Hashem without any introduction. That is why the מדרש (ויקרא רבה פרשה א ד"ה טו ד"ה א) is puzzled by the opening of this week's פרשה. Why is it necessary to say ניקרא אֶל מֹשֶׁה - and He called Moshe? This is not Hashem's first time addressing Moshe, so why does the Torah emphasize that He called out to him?



The מדרש explains that this is because, despite the greatness of משה, he would never enter into the אהל מועד until he was called. Rav Aharon Kotler notes that this is similar to the comment in the מדרש that משה did not eat during his 40 days on סיני הר since he wanted to follow the local custom of the angels. Rav Aharon comments that these are examples of דרך ארץ קדמה לתורה - a person must behave properly before they can be a true חכם. The only way that Moshe was able to get the Torah was by first having perfect manners and being the consummate *mentsch*.

This is not to say that all that matters is that someone be a "good person" who treats others well. Being Jewish means much more. We need to learn Torah, follow the מצוות and develop a relationship with Hashem. However, in order to successfully grow spiritually, a person must first have the foundation of being a respectful, refined and compassionate individual.
