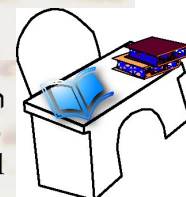

From The Rabbi's Desk

Every Friday night, when we recite kiddush, we state - וּשְׁבַת קָדְשׁוֹ בְּאֵהָבָה - וּבְרַצוֹן הַנְּחִילֵנוּ, זִכְרוֹן לַמַּעֲשֵׂה בְּרֵאשִׁית... זִכְרֵנוּ לַיְצִיאָה מִצֵּרִים - we celebrate שבת both to commemorate the creation of the world and to commemorate our leaving Egypt. While it is obvious that שבת commemorates the completion of creation, it is less obvious how it is related to our redemption from Egypt.

Rav Herschel Schachter addresses this by explaining that slaves have no control of their time, as they are constantly bound to follow the demands of their master. When בני ישראל were freed from Egypt, they became masters of their
