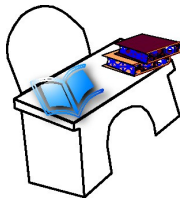

From The Rabbi's Desk

The second half of this week's double דבר אל פרשה begins with the statement אל פרשה כל עדת בני ישראל ואמרת אלהם קדשים כל לקיכם - תהיו כי קדוש אני ה' אלקיכם - Speak to all the congregation of the children of Israel, and say to them: You shall be holy; for I Hashem your God am holy. It goes without saying that all commandments which were commanded from Hashem to Moshe were meant to be transmitted to all of Israel, so why does it state that this commandment in particular needs to be addressed to 'all the congregants of Israel?'



The Talmud (ברכות דף כ"א עמוד ב) explains that it is the word עדה (community), in the context of the spies, is used to teach us that ten people make a minyan. Rav Yonatan Eibshutz suggests that this is why the word עדה is used here as well, in the expression כל עדת בני ישראל. Human beings are limited in their ability to achieve holiness. However, when they band together as a community they can reach levels way beyond that which they could reach as individuals. That is why the commandment of "You shall be holy" is directed specifically at the community.

Every individual is responsible for his or her own religious growth. However, to achieve our potential as holy people, we must grow in the context of community. We must give and receive from one another, inspire one another, and collaborate on communal goals. That which can be achieved by all of us working together will always be much greater than the sum of what can be accomplished by the individuals.
