From The Rabbi's Desk

The middle of this week's פרשה focuses on the holidays, starting with פסח and then following the calendar through the rest of the year. However, unlike other places in the Torah where we are told about the holidays, there is a break in the middle. After discussing the holiday of שבועות, the Torah inserts the commandment to provide agricultural help to the needy and then continues with ראש השנה and the rest of the holidays.

The משך חכמה suggests that there is a reason why the commandments to help the poor are included here. The holiday of שבועות commemorates מתן תורה - the special covenant between Hashem and his people. One might get the impression based on the holidays and the related sacrifices that the Torah prioritizes מצוות בין אדם למקום - commandments that relate to man's relationship with Hashem - over commandments that relate to interpersonal relationships. The Torah inserts the commandment to support the poor at this point, to emphasize that מצוות בין אדם לחבירו - those that relate to man's relationship with others - rank equally important.

There are those that think that as long as a person is kind to others, he can be considered a good Jew even if he neglects laws such as keeping kosher and שבת. This is certainly incorrect. By the same token, someone who is scrupulous in following commandments such as שבת and keeping kosher, but lacks in integrity and compassion in dealing with others, cannot be considered truly observant.

Security Committee Drill—Due to the worldwide threat of terrorism and the threat to Jewish institutions, including desecration of synagogues, Jewish Community Centers, and cemeteries the EDOS security committee requests your help and participation in a *mock* intruder drill Shabbat, May 20th,

after davening. Please follow the brief instructions (below) to insure our members and guests remain safe!

Exercise Drill #1: Armed intruder is seen entering Shul! Within seconds...

1. An EDOS security member or adult member closest to the Bimah (highest point in Shul) begins shouting loudly, *GET DOWN, GET DOWN, GET DOWN* while waving their arms up and down in a flapping-type motion. Only one person will do this, please!). Then that person immediately drops to the floor if unarmed.
2. Members and Guests immediately drop to the floor, lying as flat as possible. Those capable of helping individuals with difficulties please gently help them get down to the floor as quickly as possible.

If this were an actual event, it would likely be over very quickly and you would likely be much safer lying flat on the floor. Please try to remain quiet while on the floor as any loud outburst or conversation may impede the actions of the security team.

As this is our very first drill, we sincerely thank everyone in advance for indulging the security committee to help keep EDOS safe!
