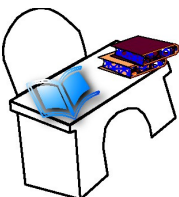

From The Rabbi's Desk

This week's פרשה introduces us the concept of the נזיר who accepts upon his or herself a lifestyle which focuses on greater spirituality by avoiding wine, hair cutting and coming in contact with the dead. The מלבי"ם asks why this form of a vow



requires its own section in the Torah. After all, isn't this a vow like any other which a person accepts on themselves and could even undo through התרת נדרים - the annulment of vows? The מלבי"ם answers that the laws of נזיר are different than that of all other vows in that there are limitations. For example, a vow can be accepted on whatever the person wishes for any amount of time. In the case of the נזיר one must accept all of the prohibitions together for a minimum thirty days. This, however, raises another perhaps bigger question. Why doesn't a person who wants to be a נזיר have the flexibility to accept the status of נזירות to whatever extent they are comfortable with?

Perhaps the answer is that while spiritual growth is a personal journey, the journey has to take place within the rubric of the Torah's rules. The fact that a person thinks that something feels right and believes that it will bring him or her closer to Hashem does not make it necessarily correct. While the desire to come closer to Hashem is universally good, the path one takes for will only be successful if it is within the bounds prescribed by the Torah.
