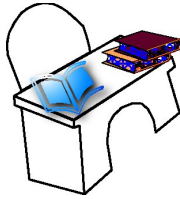

From The Rabbi's Desk

This week's פרשה contains the only appearance of the inverted letter nuns which mark off the familiar verses of ויהי בנסוע הארון. Rashi comments that this comes to indicate that these פסוקים are not in their proper place but rather were moved to this spot in the Torah to separate between two negative events. While the events recorded after these פסוקים describing the complaints of the people for meat, are clearly negative, it is unclear why the prior פסוקים which discuss the people leaving הר סיני are considered negative.



The Ramban quotes a מדרש which states that בני ישראל ran from הר סיני like children fleeing school as the negative event which preceded the inverted letter nuns. Rav Elya Lopian comments that people can go through life with a material or spiritual focus. If a person has a spiritual focus, he or she will be satisfied with the minimum amount of material wealth needed to get by. If the person is focused on the material, he or she will never be satisfied and will constantly aim to accumulate more. When בני ישראל ran away from הר סיני they indicated that they had heard enough and weren't interested in more communication from Hashem. This indicated that they were not truly focused on spiritual growth. Hence, the next פסוקים talk about their desire for meat.

We are all given limited time and strength in this world and we need to decide where we will focus our time and energy. The message of we learn from here is that our focus and aspiration should be towards spiritual, rather than material, goals.
