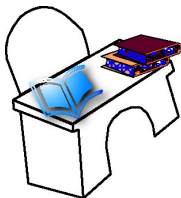

From The Rabbi's Desk

This week's הפטרה tells the story of יפתח who is first chased away by his family but later is approached by the elders who ask that he lead them in their battle against עמון. After inquiring about their sudden change of heart, he agrees to lead them into battle on the condition that he is accepted as the leader of the nation. While יפתח is clearly not revered as one of our greatest leaders (see רמב"ם, רמב"ם, רמב"ם), it is still hard to imagine that someone who became one of the שופטים would refuse to help his people unless he was guaranteed personal honor!

Rav Chaim Shmuelevitz explains that the actions of יפתח had nothing to do with a desire for honor, but rather with an understanding of leadership. In order for a leader to successfully lead, he or she needs the full support of the people. יפתח insisted that the people accept him as their leader not for his ego, but rather in order for him to lead successfully.



In our current generation, cynicism has crept into to the public psyche and we have grave doubts regarding the worthiness of our leaders. These doubts undermine their ability to lead and society stagnates without effective leadership. It can be challenging to find a suitable leader and we pray that we are given worthy leadership. At the same time it is our responsibility to accept the authority of our leaders and thereby allow them to lead us forward successfully.
