If you prefer to drive your own car, we will charge \$15 per a person for the food and glasses. We plan to leave early in the morning (5 AM) to Cheyenne for Shacharit and breakfast. We will continue to Ayres National Bridge in Douglas to view the actual eclipse.

After the eclipse we head back and have a BBQ upon our return. If you are interested in joining the planned Shul trip, we need a firm commitment and payment no later than Sunday, July 30th.

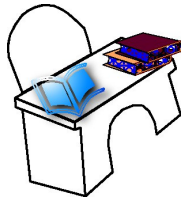
Condolences

From The Rabbi's Desk

When Moshe retells the story of the war against עוג in this week's פרשה, he recounts that Hashem told Moshe that he need not fear עוג. Rashi comments that it was not the tremendous size of עוג (see ברכות נ"ד ע"ב) that concerned Moshe, since he was not afraid of any of the other giants. Rather, Moshe's concern was that עוג had a merit in that he was the one who informed אברהם that לויט had been taken captive.

Moshe's concern is hard to understand, given that no matter how great the merit of informing אברהם was, עוג had already received the reward of an extremely long life. Beyond that, Moshe must have known that the merits of אברהם and his descendants far



outweighed this one merit. Last, the מדרש tells us that עוג passed along the information because he hoped אברהם would die in battle and then עוג would be able to marry שרה! How could Moshe be concerned that בני ישראל would be overwhelmed by such a minor, dated, and not particularly impressive good deed?

Rav Avigdor Nevenzahl suggests that the answer lies in the משנה we focused on in our study of פרקי אבות last week - הוי זהיר במצוה קלה כבחמורה שאין אתה - Be as careful with a minor mitzvah as with a major one, for you do not know the rewards of the mitzvot. Even this good deed, which was done with bad intentions, had the ability to reap great rewards hundreds of years later.

Whenever we need some motivation to do the right thing, we should keep in mind that the rewards of what we might even consider a minor act may be beyond what we could imagine.
