From The Rabbi's Desk

This week's פרשה is known as פרשת עקב based on the opening verse והיה עקב האלה - תשמעון את המשפטים האלה And it shall come to pass, because you listen to these commandments, which is followed by promises of earthly blessings. Rashi comments that the word "עקב" alludes to the heel (same letters), to indicate that these blessing are the rewards for the "minor" commandments that one would usually tread over without noticing. This approach is questioned by many later opinions as the Talmud (קידושין ל"ט ע"ב) comments that there is no earthly reward for the performance of the מצוות.

Among the answers offered is a suggestion of the כתב סופר that the performance of the מצוות should permeate every aspect of one's life such that 'neutral' actions such as eating, sleeping and going to work become elevated. This elevation in earthly activities will be rewarded with earthly reward. However, the ultimate reward for doing the will of Hashem will be saved for the world to come.

Being שומר תורה ומצוות should not just be something we do; it should be who we are. By "digging in our heels" and committing our entire being to השם we will be guaranteed lives of blessing, both in this world and in the world to come.
