From The Rabbi's Desk

This week's Torah reading ends with the famous פרשת זכור in which we are commanded to remember the actions of עמלק. It is generally assumed that this commandment is separate and distinct from the commandment to wipe out עמלק but closely related since what we are remembering is זכר עמלק - to

wipe out the memory of Amalek. Being that we are not obligated to destroy Amalek at this point in history, (see מנחת חינוך תר"ה) what is the current significance of the commandment to remember?

Rav Moshe Feinstein suggests that the underlying message of the commandment of זכירת עמלק is to remember that there is evil in the world. עמלק had seen the miracles that Hashem performed for His people and knew that they would not be attacked when the Jewish people conquered the land of כנען, but they attacked out of a hatred for Hashem and his people. They did not fight in self-defense or in the hope of financial gain but rather because they were hateful people.

Unfortunately, the commandment of זכירת עמלק is not our only reminder of evil in the world. Hate groups feel emboldened in the current political climate and are taking advantage of their constitutional right to spew hate. These are not decent human beings. They are the embodiment of Amalek. We are commanded to remember that evil continues to exist and that it is our duty to stand strong in defense of what is right and good.
