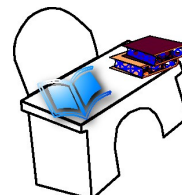

From The Rabbi's Desk

This week's פרשה features the תוחכה which spells out in great detail the reward and punishment we will receive based on whether or not we fulfill the word of Hashem. The Torah begins with the positive and states that in the event that we follow

the word of Hashem, וְבָאוּ עִלְיֶיךָ כָּל הַבְּרָכוֹת הָאֵלֶּה וְהִשְׁיִגְךָ, which is generally translated as “And all these blessings shall come upon you, and overtake you”. Many commentators are bothered by the word “וְהִשְׁיִגְךָ”. Couldn’t the פסוק been written without that word and still deliver the same message?

Rav Aharon ben-Zion Shurin suggests that perhaps the correct translation of “וְהִשְׁיִגְךָ” is not from the root ‘to overtake’ but rather based on the word השגה which means to understand. With that in mind, the proper meaning of the פסוק is that “all these blessings shall come upon you, and you should understand it”, meaning you should appreciate why these blessing are appropriate for you. Hashem’s blessing come in many forms, including health, wealth, family, knowledge, success and more. Hashem’s provides each of us with the blessings we need.

Oftentimes, when Hashem decides to bestow blessing upon us, we fail to appreciate how much we needed blessing in that particular area. That is why we are promised the additional level of not only receiving Hashem's blessings but also being given the ability to understand and appreciate how wonderful the blessing is.
