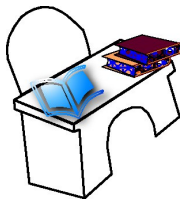

From The Rabbi's Desk

Our calendar is set up in such a way that we always read פרשת נצבים, either on its own or, like this year, together with ראש השנה before שבת וילך. Several reasons are proposed for the positioning of this parsha in the calendar. Some suggest that the opening words of the Parsha - אַתֶּם נֹצְבִים הַיּוֹם בְּלִפְנֵי ה' - Today you stand before Hashem your God - alludes to Rosh Hashana, the day we all stand before Hashem in judgment. Others suggest that נצבים is placed where it is because it contains the מצוה of תשובה and Rosh Hashana marks the beginning of the עשרת ימי תשובה.

Rav Soloveitchik builds on this by pointing out that while תשובה is mentioned in the פרשה, the actual theme of the פרשה is communal responsibility. The placement of the מצוה of תשובה in this פרשה comes to remind us that repentance is not only an individual commandment to better one's self, but also an obligation on every individual to care for the spiritual well being of all members of the greater Jewish community.

We must all take time out to consider our actions and try to improve ourselves as we enter the days of judgement and the new year. But that is not enough. Beyond that, we must also focus on those who may not have benefitted from a Jewish education and reach



out to them so we can grow as a community and as a people.
