Hoshana Rabba—Wednesday, we observe Hoshana Rabba, and begin services very early. This is the seventh and last day of Sukkot, named for the fact that more hoshanot are said on this day than all the previous days of the festival. Hoshana Rabba is known as the day of the final sealing of judgment, which began on Rosh Hashana. During the festival of Sukkot the world is judged for water and for the blessings of the fruit and crops. The seventh day is the final sealing and since human life depends on water, there are additional prayers as on Yom Kippur.



It is traditional during the שלש רגלים to bless one who receives an aliyah with wishes of לראות את כל ישראל אחיו - and he should merit going up to Jerusalem with all of Israel his brothers. While this is most definitely a most appropriate and beautiful blessing, one can ask why the extra word כל? Would the blessing not have been as complete without the word? Also, not everyone is obligated to travel to Jerusalem for the holidays. For example, a person that is ill does not have to go. Therefore, leaving out the word "all" would perhaps be more accurate.



The Brisker Rav, Rav Velvel Soloveitchik, explains that one question answers the other. We specifically say "all" to indicate that we are praying that everyone should be in good health, in order that we can enjoy the holiday together. Only then is our joy complete. I would like to take this opportunity to bless us all that we should have a חג שמח, full of true happiness and health for all.

Dr. Matt Goldish: The "Old Yishuv"—Dr. Matt Goldish, Professor of History and long-time Director of the Melton Center for Jewish Studies at Ohio State University, speaks at EDOS on Sunday night, October 15th, at 5 PM. He discusses *The 'Old Yishuv': Jewish Life in the Land of Israel Before Zionism*. This topic covers Jewish life in Eretz Yisrael prior to the surge of settlement activity beginning in the late 1800s.

The Kiddush today is sponsored by the EDOS Women's Auxiliary and EDOS Kiddush Fund.


Community Events
