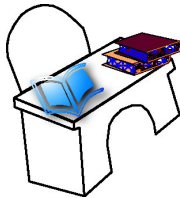

### From The Rabbi's Desk

Upon learning of Sarah's death, אברהם prepares to לְסַפֵּד לְשָׂרָה וּלְבַכְתָּהּ - to eulogize and cry over her loss. Notably, the letter "כ" is written small in the word וּלְבַכְתָּהּ. The בעל הטורים suggests that this is an indication that אברהם minimized his crying since שרה was already an old woman. At first blush, this comment strikes us as insensitive and wrong. After so many years of working together towards the common goal of introducing Hashem to the world, after having suffered together through infertility and various other challenges, could Avraham's mourning be minimized since, "after all, she was old?" And beyond that, did אברהם really consider her old? After all, he was ten years older and after Sarah's death got remarried, conceived several children and lived another 38 years?



Perhaps we can understand this based on a suggestion by Rabbi Norman Lamm. Crying and mourning are effective ways of dealing with the loss of a loved one, as the physical expression lightens the psychological load. The bond that was created by the many years and life experiences that שרה shared with אברהם was so great that אברהם never wanted to let go. Avraham minimized his crying to maintain the feeling of loss within himself so that שרה would always be with him.

We live in a society where expression is maximized. Every news item must be posted, tweeted, retweeted and commented upon. We learn from here that sometimes less is more. Sometimes quiet contemplation of that which is most dear to us, is far more valuable than shouting it to the world.
