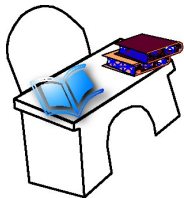

From The Rabbi's Desk

Most people focus their attention on the beginning of this week's פרשה, which discusses the birth of יעקב and עשו and the transaction which transfers the rights of the בכור; the end of the פרשה which features יעקב

tricking יצחק into blessing him. Very few focus on the middle of the פרשה which discusses Yitzchak's repeated attempts to dig wells and his neighbor's constant attempts to steal them. In fact, much discussion has focused on why this is relevant at all. (See, for example, רמב"ן כ בראשית פרק כו פסוק כ).



In brief, the Torah tells us that the servants of יצחק dug and named a first well which the local shepherds claimed as their own. Then they dug and named a second well which was

greeted with another round of competing claims. Finally, יצחק dug a third well which was accepted as his. Rabbi Joseph Baumol asks, what was different about the third well that led to Yitzchak's success in holding on to it? The answer is that, unlike the first two wells that were dug by his servants, the third well יצחק dug himself. Taking personal responsibility and doing a job one's self will always lead to a greater outcome than handing the job over to another person.

The Talmud (קידושין דף מא עמוד א) מצוה בו - it is preferable to do a מצוה one's self, rather than to appoint an agent. Bothering to do something yourself indicates that it is important to you. If we send our children to school, using the teachers as our agents in educating our children, without being involved personally, there is a real danger that we will not be successful. If we take part in the transmission of the mesorah by taking an interest in and sharing in our children's learning and setting an example for them, we are likely to see much greater success.
