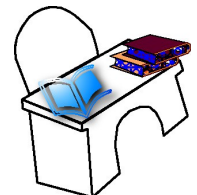

הרן to שבע. Rashi comments that Yaakov had the miracle of קפיצת הדרך on his trip whereby he was able to reach his destination sooner than expected. However, unlike when אליעזר was blessed with this miracle in פרשת חיי שרה and was transported to his destination in short amount of time, here the miracle involves הר המוריה, the location of the בית המקדש, coming to greet Yaakov on his way out of the land of Israel. What is the reason for the difference between these two miracles?

The סוכת דוד suggests that the miracle that occurred to Yaakov in this פרשה contained a specific message. Yaakov was leaving Israel and would be living most of the rest of his days outside of the land of Israel. Hashem is telling sending Yaakov that while he must

live outside of Israel, he is in fact taking the בית המקדש and the holiness of Israel with him. Before Yaakov left Israel, he spent fourteen years immersed in Torah study in the study houses of Shem and Ever. This preparation would enable him to retain the holiness of Israel and the בית המקדש wherever he went.

In a perfect world we would (and one day soon, God willing, will) live in Israel. Each of us for our own reasons, now live in חוץ לארץ for the time being. Our challenge is to elevate this suboptimal situation and maximize our connection to Hashem. The lesson of יעקב אבינו is that it is possible. If we study the Torah and focus on spiritual growth, we have the ability to take the בית המקדש with us, wherever we are.
