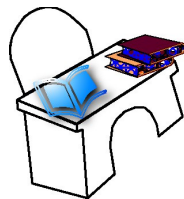

From The Rabbi's Desk

When the Torah discusses Esav's lineage it states twice within eight verses (פרק לו) פרק לו (פסוק א' וח) that עשו הוא אָדוֹם - Esav is Edom. This is strange not only because of the repetition, but also because and no point does the Torah find it necessary to tell us that יעקב and ישראל are the same person.

lesson hidden in these seemingly superfluous פסוקים Rashi comments (בראשית פרק כה פסוק כה) that Esav was given his name לפי שהיה נעשה ונגמר - because he was made a complete mature person. Similarly, the name Edom ("Red") refers to when he says הַלְעִיטֵנִי גַם הַיּוֹם מִן הָאֲדָמָה הַזֹּאת - feed me this red food, referring to the food that יעקב had just completed cooking. Both names are referring to the same reality - Esav was born and remained the same person throughout his life. In contrast, Yaakov's life is marked by growth. He begins life with the name Yaakov because he was holding on to the heel of Esav, in a sense trying to keep up with him. However, his wrestling with and triumph over the angel then earns him the name of ישראל, a name signifying authority While Esav spends his life comfortable with who he is, Yaakov spends his

life struggling to move forward.
