Rabbi David Lebor, representing Yeshivat Shaalvim, is at EDOS this Shabbat, December 8<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup>. Friday night he speaks on the topic *Yosef's Brothers* — *The Biggest Question*; at a pre-Shacharit shiur, on the topic *Do We Pasken Halacha Like HaShem*; and prior to Mussaf, on the topic, *The Chinuch of Chanukah*. He speaks at DAT Minyan Shabbat Afternoon (*Rachel and Through History*) and at Seudah Shlishit (*The Secret of Shabbat*). Rabbi David Lebor has dedicated his life to teaching Torah in Yeshivat Shaalvim. He began there in 1972 as a student, and progressed to receive his Rabbinical Ordination there, and is now Senior Ram and Lecturer. While on sabbatical in 1996, he founded the Kollel Torah Mitzion in Chicago, which today is the largest Kollel of its kind in the world. He is the author of numerous articles, pamphlets, and books.

# From The Rabbi's Desk

The Torah tells of the discussion of the brothers, as they see יוֹטי from a distance and begin to plot their actions against him. The first suggestion is that he be killed, as the פּסוֹק states - נְּטִרְּהָ לְּכִוּ וְנַשֵּׁלְכֵהוֹ בָּאַחֵד הַבְּרוֹת וְאָמֵרְנוּ - Come now therefore, and let us kill him, and throw him into one of the pits, and we will say: An evil beast has devoured him; and we shall see what will become of his dreams. This followed by Reuvain's suggestion that he be thrown in the pit

without be killed and ultimately Yehuda's suggestion that he be sold. While this discussion is all relevant, one has to question the quote of *we shall see what will become of his dreams*. If he is killed, of course the dreams will never come to fruition.

Rav Chaim Yaakov Goldvicht teaches that the underlying disagreement between <code>\POI</code> and his brothers was regarding the proper interaction with society at large. The brothers believed that society should be avoided because of the potential danger to one's faith, while <code>\POI</code> believed that a Jew must engage the world to spread the word of Hashem. So the brothers decide to sell him to test his hypothesis and see what becomes of him when he lives in Egyptian society. This brings perspective to their utter shock when, 22 years later, they find <code>\POI</code> as a top ranked official in palace while still maintaining his righteous ways.

Our community believes in the philosophy of מוסף as we interact with general society and strive to be a light unto the nations. While we hope and pray for the same success that איוסף had, we must also keep in mind the very real concerns of his brothers. We can only serve as a positive influence, a light unto the nations, if we are vigilant in maintaining that which makes us unique.
