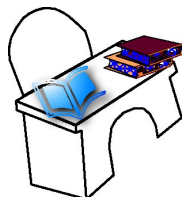

From The Rabbi's Desk

The Torah introduces us to Moshe, Aharon and their lineage by first listing off the lineage of ראובן, then שמעון until finally reaching the relevant tribe of לוי. There is, however, a notable difference in the presentation. The Torah first introduces בני ראובן - the sons of Reuvain - and בני שמעון - the sons of Shimon. However, the next tribe is introduced as לוי - and these are the names of the sons of Levi. Why the need for the seemingly superfluous mention of the names?



The *שליה הקדוש* suggests that there was something special in the names of the sons of לוי. As you may recall, being the priestly tribe, the tribe of לוי was exempt from the work imposed on the other tribes. As such, they did not feel the pain of the slavery on a daily basis. Therefore, לוי named his sons in a way that would constantly remind him of the brothers' suffering. His first son (גרשון) indicates being a foreigner. (קהת) indicates weakness. (מר) indicates bitterness. This is why the Torah focuses us on the names of the family of לוי.

The unfortunate reality of the times that we live in is that there is hardly ever (if ever) a time that some of our brothers and sisters somewhere in the world are not in some sort of imminent danger. Our natural

inclination is to be grateful that we are safe. This gratitude should always be coupled with care and concern for those who find themselves in situations that are more unstable. We must actively keep their plight at the forefront of our minds, and do whatever we can to help.
