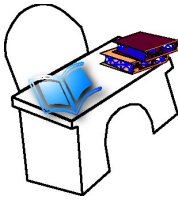

From The Rabbi's Desk

Of all of the Ten Commandments, perhaps the most difficult one is the last one, the commandment of לא תחמוד - you should not covet. While it is normal to command a person to act or abstain from an action, it is whole different realm to insist that a person feel or not feel a certain way.



The Ramban in his commentary on פרשת קדושים, in פרשת קדושים, ויקרא פרק יט פסוק ד, quotes a מדרש which states that the entire ten commandments can be found in פרשת קדושים. In demonstrating how this is so, the מדרש says that the commandment not to covet appears as the commandment ואהבת לרעך כמוך - to love your neighbor as yourself. The message is clear. If you truly love your neighbor as much as you love yourself, you will never covet, since you are as happy with his happiness as you would be with your own. While this does make logical sense, it still begs the question of how does one reach that level of closeness to one's neighbor.

Rabbi Joshua Hoffman suggested that the answer perhaps lies in an idea set force by Rav Shimon Shkop in the introduction to his book שיערי יושר where he focuses on Hillel's famous dictum אם אין אני לי מי לי - If I am not for myself, who is for me? Rav Shkop says that everyone must first take care of themselves, however different people have different definitions of self. Most people will naturally expand the definition to include immediate family, with the understanding that one's first obligation is not just to himself or herself, but to one's spouse and children who are an extension of self. Others expand self even further to include an obligation to take care of their community. Other can go even further to include the entire Jewish people and perhaps all of humanity. When a person can break down the barriers between himself and others and accept the obligation to care for them as if they were himself, that closeness will lead to love and the elimination of jealousy.
