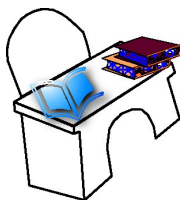

From The Rabbi's Desk

When discussing the ארון, the first and arguably the most important of the vessels that would be placed in the משכן, the תורה states that the poles which are inserted into the rings on the side of the ארון may never be removed from the rings. The Rambam (הלכות כלי המקדש) (פרק ב הלכה יג) actually lists this as a negative commandment and if one would remove the poles, he or she would be liable to receive lashes. This law seems odd, as other vessels (the שלחן and the מזבח הזהב) also have poles which were attached in order to allow them to be transported and there is no prohibition involved in detaching their rings. In fact, their rings were detached whenever these vessels were placed in the משכן.

Chassidic thought states that the ארון represents the Torah, which is somewhat obvious since its purpose is to store the לוחות which represent the word of Hashem. The poles which are made to support the ארון represent those who give of their time and money to support Torah learning. The message of this commandment is to teach us that the teachers and the supporters of the Torah are inextricably linked. Torah learning would suffer without the support of the community and the community would suffer if we did not have those who learn and teach Torah.



It is natural for people to think that their job in life is the most important. Those who spend their days involved in Torah study must never forget the importance of the Torah supporters and those who support themselves in other professions must appreciate the importance of Torah study to the entire community.
