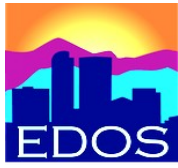

Shabbat Hagadol Drasha—This year we are pleased to welcome Rabbi Yisroel Engel to provide our Shabbat Hagadol drasha. The talk will begin at 6:30 PM.

Pesach Times—

Sunday: Bedikah as soon after 8:30 PM as feasible
Monday: Fast of the Firstborn. A siyyum is held at the shul after Shacharit. Latest time to eat chametz: 10:42 AM. Latest time to burn chametz: 11:50 AM. First seder. Chatzot/ Midnight: 12:58 AM.
Tuesday: No preparation for 2nd day until after the first day is completed (8:38 PM). At night we begin counting omer. Second seder.
Wednesday: Chol HaMoed begins after 8:31 PM.

Pesach Kiddush & Kitchen—While the kitchen will be closed and locked for Pesach, EDOS will have a Kiddush each day of Yom Tov and Shabbat, served in the social hall. Also, this year, the coffee station and mini fridge will be kosher for Pesach.

Annual Event—The EDOS annual event is planned for August. The board is forming a committee to plan and run the event. Anyone interested in helping with this important program please let Shlomo know.

Walk to Free the Hostages—Meets at Washington Park every Sunday at 2 PM **this week only, 10 AM**, to walk around the lake until all are freed. Meeting place is at Mississippi Avenue, at the entrance to park. Run For Their Lives is a global initiative with over 172 groups around the world, to raise awareness for the immediate release of the hostages still being held in Gaza by the terrorist organization Hamas. Most of the hostages are civilians including 14 women, 9 elderly over the age of 65, and 2 children.
