On Shabbat of June 8th, one hour before mincha, Professor Chaim Saiman from Villanova University speaks at shul. His talk is entitled *On* the Road to Jericho: The Talmudic Walk Between Christian Ethics and American Law. Chaim Saiman is a Professor of Law who specializes in Jewish law, insurance law, and arbitration. Chaim's book Halakhah: The Rabbinic Idea of Law was published by Princeton in 2018. Chaim has served as a visiting professor at Harvard, Penn, Hebrew University, and the University of Toronto, and has been appointed as an arbitrator on rabbinical courts and an expert witness in insurance law and Jewish law in federal courts. He serves as a Dayan on the Beth Din of America and is currently working on a book on the American beth din system.

Run For Their Lives is a global initiative with over 172 groups around the world, to raise awareness for the immediate release of the hostages still being held in Gaza by the terrorist organization Hamas. Most of the hostages are civilians including 14 women, 9 elderly over the age of 65, and 2 children.
